Calgary's Deerfoot Trail gets up to speed

Normal speed limits resume as major paving project finishes

Calgary...

Traffic is back to normal on the northern portions of the Deerfoot Trail as a major paving project wrapped up early on the morning of August 30.

Posted speed is back up to the normal 100 km/h in the northbound lanes between 17 Avenue South and the Stoney Trail interchange site.

Starting June 15, Deerfoot Trail underwent major resurfacing work on the southbound lanes between McKnight Boulevard and 17 Avenue South. The work then shifted to the northbound lanes from 17 Avenue South to the new interchange site at Stoney Trail. South Rock Ltd. completed the \$14-million project on time and on budget.

Most of the paving work took place between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. daily to minimize traffic disruptions.

The Alberta government and South Rock Ltd. thank motorists for their cooperation and patience during the project.
