Bridge repairs disrupts traffic on Highways 14 and 21 east of Edmonton

Edmonton... Motorists can expect traffic disruptions as repairs begin June 2 on the bridge that carries Highway 21 over Highway 14 east of Edmonton. Work is scheduled to be completed by June 30, weather permitting.

The work will include repairs to the underside of the concrete girders that were damaged by a high load collision. Repair costs will be recovered from the responsible party.

The lane width on the westbound lanes of Highway 14 will be reduced to 4.5 metres and the vertical clearance will be reduced to 5.1 metres. The lane width on Highway 21 will be reduced to 3.7 metres. Wide loads and over height loads are asked to use alternate routes.

Motorists are asked to use caution in the area and obey all signs and flag people. Motorists are reminded that fines for speeding are doubled through construction zones when workers are present.
