Paving disrupts Queen Elizabeth II Highway traffic near Leduc

Leduc... Motorists can expect delays, lane closures, and speed reductions on Queen Elizabeth II Highway south of Leduc.

Paving and guard rail replacement begins June 21 and affects both the northbound and southbound lanes from the junction with Highway 39 at Leduc to the junction with Highway 13. The work will start on the southbound lanes at the Highway 39 junction and move southward to the Highway 13 junction. Work then moves to the northbound lanes and moves northward. Project completion is expected by Aug. 30, weather permitting.

Traffic will be reduced to one lane where there is construction activity and speed will be reduced to 80 km/h through the construction zone.

The \$5.9 million project also includes improvements to the deceleration ramp into the vehicle inspection station south of Leduc.

Motorists should use caution in the area and obey all signs, message boards, and flag people. Motorists are reminded that fines for speeding are doubled through construction zones when workers are present.
