Paving disrupts traffic on Highways 831 and 855 near Smoky Lake

Smoky Lake... Motorists can expect lane reductions and speed limit reductions on Highways 831 and 855 in the Smoky Lake area.

The Highway 831 project includes paving seven kilometres from north of Highway 656 to south of Highway 661. Motorists can expect alternating one-way traffic and the speed limit will be reduced to 50 km/h through the construction zone.

The Highway 855 project includes side slope improvement and paving 14 kilometers northward from the North Saskatchewan River to the junction with Highway 28. Motorists can expect alternating one-way traffic and the speed limit will be reduced to 50 km/h through the construction zone.

The projects begin Aug. 25 and will be completed by Oct. 15, weather permitting.

Motorists should use caution in the area and obey all signs, message boards, and flag people. Motorists are reminded that fines for speeding are doubled through construction zones when workers are present.
