## Province orders Suncor to address excessive H2S emissions

*Edmonton*... The Alberta government has ordered Suncor Energy Inc. to take immediate steps to address unacceptable levels of hydrogen sulphide (H<sub>2</sub>S) emissions at its site near Fort McMurray.

The Environmental Protection Order comes in response to numerous occasions when ground level concentration (GLC) for H<sub>2</sub>S exceeded acceptable standards. Suncor has also had several incidents in 2007 when the measured values of H<sub>2</sub>S in the ambient air at stationary air monitoring stations downwind from the Suncor plant site exceeded the one-hour and 24-hour Alberta Ambient Air Quality Objectives for H<sub>2</sub>S.

Alberta Environment has been actively working with Suncor since 2006 on its Ground Level Concentration (GLC) Exceedances and Emissions Management Program to minimize H<sub>2</sub>S emissions and enhance ambient air quality.

Under the order, Suncor must continue its work on the GLC Exceedances and Emissions Management Program, and audit all process-related incidents in 2007 that may have led to unacceptable H<sub>2</sub>S ground-level concentrations. Suncor must develop a monitoring plan to help identify sources of H<sub>2</sub>S and other odorous sulphur compounds from the plant site by January 14, 2008.

A modeling plan for H<sub>2</sub>S and sulphur compound emissions must be submitted to Alberta Environment by February 7, 2008. Based on the monitoring plan, the modeling plan will detail likely H<sub>2</sub>S concentration on and off the plant site and include a worst-case consequence analysis for on- and off-site impacts.

Suncor must submit monthly written progress reports to Alberta Environment detailing the steps taken to comply with the order.

Environmental Protection Orders are issued under the authority of Alberta's *Environmental Protection* and Enhancement Act. Alberta Environment can issue Environmental Protection Orders to remedy environmental problems where there has been a release of a substance that has caused or may cause an adverse effect to the environment.
