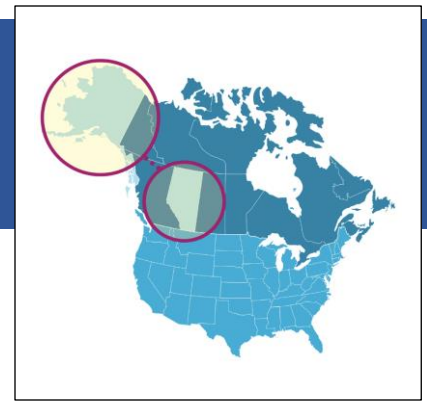


## Alaska and Alberta: Strong Partners, Trusted Neighbors

- Alberta is Alaska's 7<sup>th</sup> largest trading partner

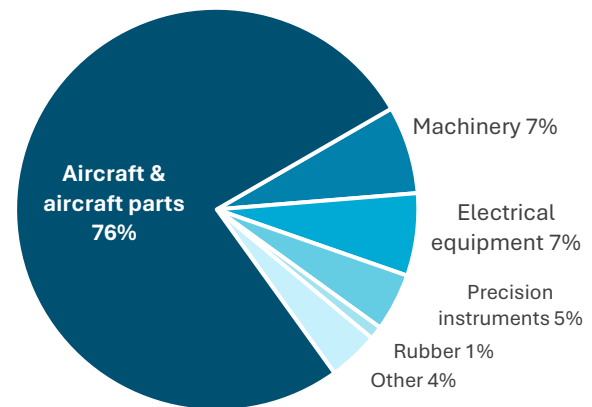
### Alaska – Alberta Trade \$USD

## Alberta Snapshot

ARCTEC Alaska, a partnership between ATCO Structures & Logistics and ASRC Primus, is responsible for the operation and maintenance of 15 long-range radar sites that comprise the Alaska Radar System. This system directly supports the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD), ensuring U.S. airspace security.
