

## Alberta Snapshot

Alberta and Arizona share strong economic ties, particularly in the aerospace, technology, and tourism sectors.

Alberta companies like WestJet maintain connections with Arizona's robust tourism industry, while Arizona-based firms such as Honeywell and RTX (formerly known as Raytheon) operate in Alberta's aerospace supply chain. In addition, Edmonton-based Capital Power provides affordable, reliable electricity to Arizonans through the 1,092 MW Harquahala natural gas-fired power facility.

Trade between our regions is growing, with Alberta exporting agricultural products, machinery, and metals to Arizona. Cultural ties are evident in the significant number of Albertans who travel to Arizona as "snowbirds," contributing to the state's tourism economy. Collaborative efforts in renewable energy and water management further strengthen our relationship.
