
## Arkansas and Alberta: Strong Partners, Trusted Neighbors

## Arkansas' Top Exports to Alberta \$USD


Iron & steel: \$38.8 million

Alberta and Arkansas maintain a growing partnership focused on agriculture, manufacturing, and forestry. Alberta exports agricultural machinery, wood products, and chemicals to Arkansas, supporting its farming and industrial sectors.

Arkansas-based companies like Tyson Foods source products from Alberta, including high-quality beef. Collaboration in forestry and paper products aligns with both regions' resource-based economies.

Cultural connections include shared interests in rural development and academic exchanges between universities. Arkansas and Alberta continue to explore partnerships in logistics and environmental management, particularly in water conservation and sustainable resource use.
