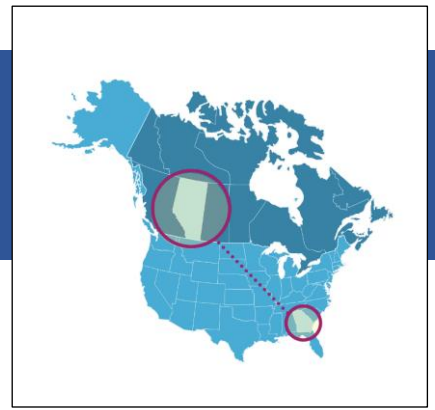


Georgia and Alberta: Strong Partners, Trusted Neighbors

- **904,000** U.S. jobs are supported by trade with Alberta

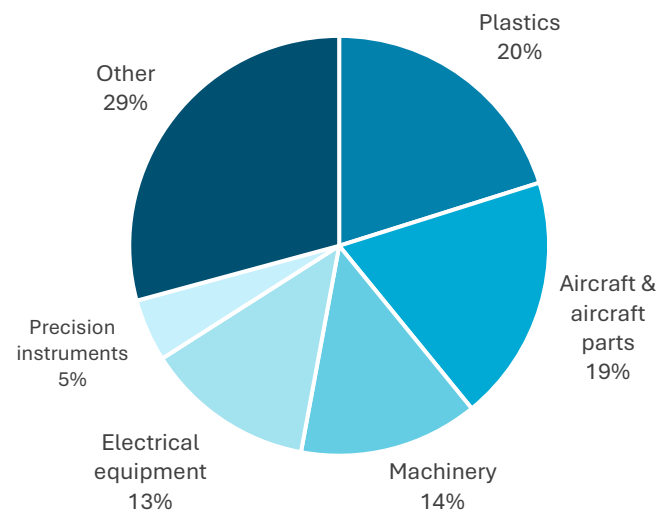
Georgia – Alberta Trade \$USD

- Bilateral trade: **\$538.5 million**
- Georgia exports to Alberta: **\$216 million**
- Georgia imports from Alberta: **\$322.5 million**

Georgia’s Top Exports to Alberta \$USD

- Plastics: **\$43.5 million**
- Aircraft & aircraft parts: **\$41 million**
- Machinery: **\$29.8 million**
- Electrical equipment: **\$28.2 million**
- Precision instruments: **\$10.4 million**

Alberta Snapshot

Alberta and Georgia share strong ties in logistics, agriculture, and technology. Alberta exports agricultural products such as beef and grains to Georgia, supporting its food processing industry. Energy evolution is a natural partnership for Alberta and Georgia. Qcells is producing solar panels in partnership with Alberta-based Stantec, a global leader in sustainable design, providing multiple areas of support including construction, architecture, engineering, structural/civil engineering, and environmental, water, and wastewater services, which includes collaboration on the \$2.5 billion project in Cartersville.

Companies like UPS and Coca-Cola also collaborate with Alberta on supply chain and distribution projects, while Georgia-Pacific has its Canadian base of operations in Edmonton, Alberta.

Academic partnerships flourish between Georgia and Alberta, such as learning software developed by Edmonton’s Onlea for Georgia Tech University students in engineering.
