

# Alberta Snapshot

Calgary, Alberta-based Enbridge delivers an average of three million barrels of crude oil and liquids every day, moving 30 percent of the crude produced in North America. The Enbridge Cushing Terminal in Cushing, Oklahoma is not only Enbridge's largest tank farm, but is also the largest crude oil facility in the world, with more than more than 85 storage tanks on nearly 1,000 acres providing approximately 26 million barrels in shell capacity. Cushing Terminal is a vital transshipment point on the energy landscape and is the most significant trading hub for North American crude.

Alberta companies such as Pembina Pipeline and TC Energy have investments in Oklahoma's energy infrastructure, while Oklahoma-based firms such as Devon Energy and Chesapeake Energy operate in Alberta's energy sector.

Trade is driven by Alberta's exports of industrial machinery, petrochemicals, and agricultural products, which support Oklahoma's oilfield and farming industries.



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
