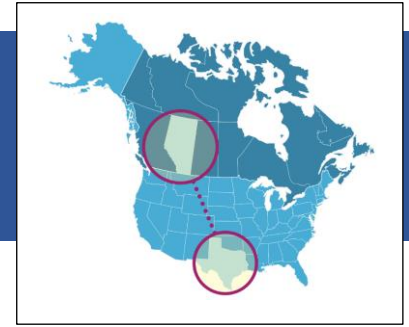


Texas and Alberta: Strong Partners, Trusted Neighbors

- Alberta is Texas' 16th largest trading partner

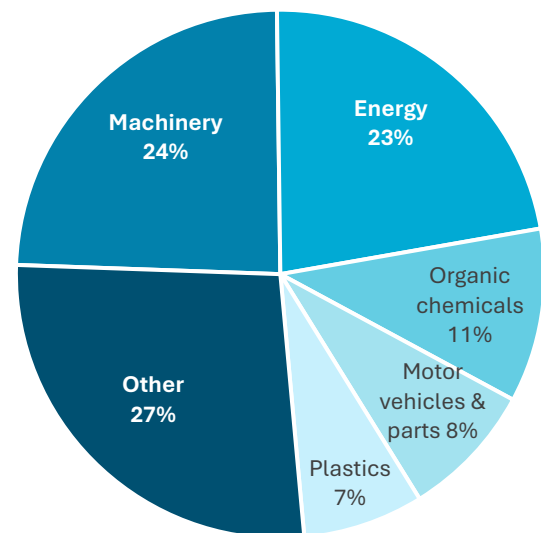
Texas – Alberta Trade \$USD

Alberta Snapshot

Alberta and Texas share robust economic and cultural ties, driven by their leadership in energy, agriculture, and innovation.

Calgary, Alberta-based Enbridge delivers over three million barrels of crude oil daily and transports 20% of all U.S. natural gas, much of it originating in Texas. Enbridge also powers Texas with over 562 megawatts of wind energy from its Keechi, Magic Valley, and Chapman Ranch wind farms, supporting the state's position as the U.S. leader in wind energy.

Major Alberta companies like TC Energy, Imperial Oil, and Nutrien operate extensively in Texas, while Texan firms such as ExxonMobil, Chevron, and Halliburton maintain a strong presence in Alberta.

These commercial ties are complemented by cultural connections, including shared history through John Ware, who used his freedom from slavery to become a cowboy-rancher, moving cattle from Fort Worth, Texas, to Calgary, Alberta.
