National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Updates

The NCCP Multi-Sport Calendar has been updated to December 31, 2024. Sport, Physical Activity and Recreation branch recommends registering in advance as the modules fill up quickly.

Maintenance of Certification is the NCCP policy that requires NCCP coaches to maintain their certification through professional development (PD) and training opportunities over a predetermined period.

The number of required PD points vary from sport to sport or from context to context. Be sure to browse the list of <u>Maintenance of Certification Requirements by Sport</u>. Coaches can view the number of points needed to maintain their certification on the Maintenance page of their coaching transcript on the <u>Locker</u>.
