Every Kid Can Play Grant Program: Keeping sport affordable for children and youth

Alberta non-profit organizations can now apply for funding to support affordable sport, physical activity, and recreation opportunities for children and youth through the *Every Kid Can Play* program.

- Alberta families can apply for up to \$350 per child to offset registration fees through funds directed to KidSport Alberta.
- Provincial Scope Non-Profit Organization Grant and Community-Level Non-Profit Organization Grant.
 - Funding is available to reduce costs associated with the delivery, expansion, or enhancement of existing community-level programs.

National Coaches Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Updates

September 16-22, 2024, marks the 10th annual National Coaches Week! It is a time to celebrate the positive impact coaches have on athletes and their communities across Canada.

To celebrate National Coaches Week and to show appreciation for Alberta coaches:

- Sport, Physical Activity and Recreation Branch is discounting NCCP multi-sport modules up to 50% off throughout September.
- Coaches can view the available courses on the NCCP Multi-Sport Calendar with registration for discounted September modules opening on August 1, 2024.
- Coaches are encouraged to register early as each module has limited availability and will sell out fast.
- Watch for no cost e-learnings modules on the Locker September 16-22, 2024.
- Join in the National Coaches Week celebration where local clubs and organizations can refer to the National Coaches Week Participation Guide to access graphic tools and plan their own National Coaches Week events and activities for September 16-22, 2024.

Core Training is the first of the <u>four step pathway</u> to become a NCCP Coach Developer (Learning Facilitator / Coach Evaluator). All Core Training modules will be offered at a flat rate of \$25 throughout September compared to the regular rate of \$65-\$105.

Alternatively, coaches can forward a PSO email to abcoach@gov.ab.ca and SPAR will email the registration link to them directly.

Major Sport Event (MSE) Grant: Now Open

The MSE grant program has been fully transitioned to the Ministry of Tourism and Sport and aligned with our ministry's mandate. The SPAR branch is responsible for its administration.

MSE provides financial assistance to enhance the capacity of organizations in their pursuit of, planning for, and hosting of national and international and sport events that support the social and economic well-being of Albertans and the host communities.

Grant intake deadlines are as follows:

- Intake #1: Application deadline: July 15, 2024.
- Intake #2 Application open: August 15 Application deadline: October 1.

ParticipACTION Report Card

The ParticipACTION Report Card on Physical Activity for Children and Youth is the most comprehensive assessment of child and youth physical activity in Canada. The Report Card has been replicated in over 70 cities, provinces, and countries where it has served as a blueprint for collecting and sharing knowledge about the physical activity of young people around the world.

The 2024 ParticipACTION Report Card on Physical Activity for Children and Youth reveals higher grades compared to the 2022 Report Card in some areas, including Overall Physical Activity coming in at a D+, an increase from a D at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic.
